With a quorum present, Mayor Eubanks called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag. Council Member Robinson provided the opening prayer.

CITY MANAGER

City Manager Hedges reported the City has been approved for the Community Development Block Grant for \$500,000 dollars it has been rewarded by the Georgia Department of Community Affairs. Also approved was the Revitalization Area Strategy and that will enable the City to get a Community Development Block Grant annually instead of every two years. Mayor Eubanks was recognized at the GMA Convention on behalf of the City of Pelham as being a City of Ethics. Governor Deal attended the Donnie Cochran Complex dedication and while here had the opportunity to meet Rhett Holmes of IDP Housing LLC which provided the Governor an overview of his company's plan for the Hand Trading Company Building. Other topics included were a picture of a rattlesnake that was killed on Grady Street and made the WALB news, also a picture of the new grapple truck which was purchased. Discussed and viewed the city financials.

REGULAR SESSION

MAYOR EUBANKS PRESIDING

APPROVAL OF REGULAR MEETING AGENDA

Council Member Parker made a motion to approve the agenda as written, seconded by Mayor Pro-Tem Brown. The vote was unanimous.

MINUTES FROM PRIOR MEETING

Council Member Parker made a motion to approve minutes from the August 23, 2016 Regular Meeting as written, seconded by Council Member Johnson. The vote was unanimous.

ETHICS COMMITTEE NOMINATIONS

Mayor Pro-Tem Brown made a motion to approve Resolution for the Ethics Ordinance, seconded by Council Member Robinson. The vote was unanimous.

Mayor Eubanks made a motion to appoint the Board of Ethics appointees to serve for (4) years: Mayor's appointment Bob Hodges, Council's appointment Willie Jenkins, and Mayor/Council appointment Jenny Marshall, seconded by Council Member Johnson. The vote was unanimous.

NATURAL GAS CONTRACT

Council Member Parker made a motion to authorize the Mayor to sign the revised Municipal Gas Authority of Georgia Natural Gas Contract, seconded by Mayor Pro-Tem Brown. The vote was unanimous.

LED LIGHTS FOR CITY HALL

Council Member Johnson made a motion to proceed with the implementation of installation of energy efficient LED lighting for City Hall and authorize the Mayor to sign the Lease Purchase Agreement with Wells Fargo, seconded by Council Member Williamson. The vote was unanimous.

MILLAGE RATE

The proposed millage rate for the City of Pelham is to be set at 15.037 mils and the Pelham Board of Education at 10.420 mils for 2017 at a Called Meeting to be held at 12:00 at the City of Pelham Council Chamber located at 108 Hand Avenue West on September 23rd.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS

The following department reports were included in Council packets to review: Code Enforcement, Fire Department, Police Department, and Mitchell County Animal Control.

EXECUTIVE SESSION


Council Member Williamson made a motion to close regular session and go into executive session at 7:10 p.m., seconded by Council Member Parker. The vote was unanimous. Mayor Eubanks stated the purpose of the executive session is to discuss legal matters.

RECONVENE
